

Now in our 38th season, Horizon's mission is to connect people, inspire hope and promote positive change through contemporary theatre and the stories of our times. We seek to inspire, celebrate, enlighten and build bridges between audiences and to ignite new artists and audiences with a passion for theatre that connects to their lives. We produce outstanding new plays by today's playwrights that reflect our community and are relevant, smart, entertaining, positive, and lead with hope. We offer outstanding education programs in theatre for elementary age through young professionals.

Horizon began our 2020 season with the smash-hit live production of ONCE. Almost every performance was sold-out, and we had a week-long extension of this live performance that brought the magic of love, community, and music to Atlanta audiences. Soon after ONCE closed, we were forced to close our doors due to COVID-19 mandated social-distancing. We are excited to announce our return to live indoor performances with our 2022 season, beginning in January 2022.

In the post COVID-19 world, we have expanded our mission to include **Horizon at Home:** New Online Streaming Initiative. This innovative program brings FREE, discounted, and by suggested donation virtual content to our patrons in the safety and comfort of their homes. This year, we plan to continue our virtual programming in support of and alongside our live mainstage season. Some live productions will be streamed, as union contracts and rights allow. Talkbacks, Sneak Peeks and Community Conversations will be offered both virtually and live.

We have also launched **The New Georgia Woman Project: Black Women Speak**, an exciting new project developing nine new plays by and about Black women of Georgia based on interviews with 100+ Georgia women of color. **Below you will find a summary in reverse consecutive order of Horizon's virtual and live programming from 2019-2022.**

Horizon Theatre's New Georgia Woman Project: Black Women Speak creating a series of plays chronicling the experiences of today's Black women of Georgia. The project brings together nine Black women writers, writing plays inspired by Georgia Women. Helmed by Horizon's African-American Associate Artistic Producer Director, Marguerite Hannah and Assistant Producer LaWanda Green, 100+ Georgia women of color were interviewed to develop nine new plays of and by Black women in Atlanta that will be developed at Horizon with some premiering on our stage over the next five years. Horizon presented *Black Women Speak: First Fall Look* in fall 2021 at the Alpharetta Art Center and at Horizon both live and on Zoom, introducing the project and the writers along with readings of select scenes from these new plays. The plays are currently being written and developed and will be workshopped in 2022.

The New Georgia Woman Project: Black Women Speak is sponsored in part by the National New Play Network, an alliance of professional theatres that collaborate in innovative ways to develop, produce, and extend the life of new plays. Horizon is one of only 18 theatres in the country awarded funding by the inaugural Bridge Program which supports new plays by, for, about and with BIPOC (Black, Indigenous People of Color) artist and audience communities."

# ATLANTA, SOUTHEASTERN AND WORLD PREMIERES OF CONTEMPORARY PLAYS AND MUSICALS

1) Ice cream. 2) Water fights. 3) Staying up past your bedtime and being allowed to watch TV. One fall day, a child begins a list of everything that makes life worth living when his/her mother is in the hospital recovering from "being sad". As time passes, the list grows and becomes an epic chronicle of life's small joys that impacts the storyteller in unexpected ways, offering light and hope in the dark corners. This funny and emotional journey charts the lengths we will go for those we love--and draws on the audience's help to tell the story. The story-teller is played by three separate actors, performing on different nights of the Horizon run. The Atlanta-based performers are O'Neil Delapenha, Megan Hayes, and Shelby Hofer.

"This is not like any show I have ever seen before," says director Jeff Adler, Horizon's Co-Artistic/Technical Director. "It's intimate and personal with the actors interacting directly with the audience before and during the play. Every night will be a different experience with each actor and audience bringing their stamp to the play. We have reduced the seating capacity of the theatre and included playing spaces throughout the audience to increase the intimacy while keeping COVID safe. The show is filled with humor, joy, and hope, even though it tackles the very serious topic of mental health and its legacy in a family. Audiences will leave feeling uplifted, more connected to their loved ones, and hopefully appreciative of all the small miracles that make life worth living every day."



Directed by Horizon Associate Artistic Producer, Marguerite Hannah, and featuring the talents of two of Atlanta's most dynamic actors, Enoch King and Cynthia Barker, *The Light* is a roller coaster journey of laughter, romance and despair that uncovers how the power of radical love can be a healing beacon of light. A surprise proposal takes an unexpected turn that upends the world of Genesis and Rashad, forcing them to confront a secret from the past.

Horizon was preparing to preview the exciting Southeastern Premiere production of *The Light* during the onset of the March COVID lockdown. We swiftly shifted focus to present a live-streamed Sneak Peak of this #MeToo themed play as our initial *Horizon At Home* Virtual Program offering. In addition to the Sneak Peak and to further impact our community around this powerful and important play, we also conducted two actor led discussions at Spelman and other local colleges.

The Light is scheduled to be performed in Spring 2022 as part of our live season. It is ideal for Horizon's reopening plan, as the play features a small, two-person cast and focuses on the African-American community.


Horizon At Home, our exciting new online streaming initiative https://www.horizontheatre.com/horizon-at-home/
Includes 4-tiers of programming:

- 1. **On the Horizon series:** live-streamed performances of acclaimed contemporary plays created by professional actors and directors on Zoom followed by conversations with the writer, creative team and or guest respondents related to the issues of the play.
- 2. **New South Play Festival:** new plays in development by writers from our region, women or writers of color, especially plays that speak to racial inequality. The plays are work-shopped via Zoom, culminating in free live-streamed readings.
- 3. **Educational Programs** programs that reach deep into the community, exposing young people to theatre and training future artists, including: New South Young Playwrights Contest and Festival, a free week-long playwriting intensive for high school and college students; Playwriting In-School Residencies with professional playwrights conducting free playwriting workshops in underserved high school and middle schools; and our Apprentice and Intern Companies; free training programs for early career playwrights, actors, stage managers, and arts administrators.
- 4. **Artist Events:** Interviews, performances, and innovative classes (cooking, and singing) featuring Horizon artists. Examples include A Musical Party with the Cast of ONCE, A Mother's Day event with performances of short pieces about motherhood by local writers and actors, Cooking Ala Lala (a weekly cooking show with Horizon actress Lala Cochran), a recurring talk show hosted by director Tom Jones, and Sing with Keena (singing workshop with music director Keena Redding), and a monthly performance series, *Southbound: True Life Tales from the ATL and Beyond.* Horizon is excited to successfully engage, inform, and entertain our audiences in the comfort of their home through a wide variety of social platforms.

#### **Live Streamed Extended Run Events**

Horizon At Home (HAH) our online streaming platform was a huge success in 2020/2021. Created in response to social-distancing mandates, HAH features FREE, low-cost, or by suggested donation virtual performances for our patrons to enjoy in the safety and comfort of their homes. This virtual programming gives extended access to audiences and includes artist led classes and events, educational programming, live-streamed performances, and new plays. While many of the plays and performances presented in 2020 were wildly successful and received rave reviews, we decided to feature two of the plays presented on HAH again in 2021, Love M. & Completeness:



Written by Tony-Award Winning playwright Itamar Moses (*The Band's Visit*) and produced in partnership with Science ATL, Horizon extended the run of the virtual hit new play *Completeness*. In partnership with Science ATL, we presented the show for community groups in 2021, including the Atlanta Science Festival where we hosted post show discussions with 3 local PhD candidates in science at Emory. This romantic comedy takes a modern look at love through a scientific lens.

Horizon extended this virtual hit to impact a larger audience, including a special event hosted by Positive Impact and Bet Haverim Synagogue as part of Pride month observances. 


Suehyla El-Attar is an Egyptian-American award-winning playwright and actress. She is also Horizon's lead artist for our In-School Playwriting Educational Residencies. As a writer, her work has been commissioned by and premiered at Horizon Theatre (*The Perfect Prayer*; *Third Country*) and 7 Stages (*The Doctor*, *The Devil*, & *My Dad*). She is a recipient of the Mississippi Theatre Association Playwright award (2011) and Gene Gabriel Moore Playwriting Award (2014). Her New South Playworks commissioned work *Nope. That's Just My First Name* was a huge hit with audiences.

In this one-woman show Suehyla tells hilarious stories about what it's like being a progressive Muslim, Egyptian woman living in the south. Audiences were invited to "Pick Their Own Adventure" during this innovative new show as they chose what thoughts/memories they wanted Suehyla to explore during the performance! The show ran August 23 & 30 and September 6, 2020. It will premiere live at Horizon in fall 2022 as a touring show, playing in homes, businesses and organizations after an initial run at Horizon.

This performance was wonderful! I could have listened to many more of her stories. When she performs again, I will tell my friends so they can tune in as well." - Audience Member



As part of our *Horizon for Change Series* and a New South Playworks Southeastern Premiere, Horizon is currently featuring the one-act, *A Shot: #A Love Story Inspired by Black Lives Matter*. A powerful Black Lives Matter story written by Gloria Bond Clunie, author of Horizon's *Sweet Water Taste*, and directed by Associate Artistic Producer Marguerite Hannah, the show stars two of Atlanta's best actors, Donna Biscoe and Justin Walker. When Mrs. Nettie Morris (Donna Biscoe) goes to the neighborhood campaign office of congressional hopeful Jeffrey Talbott (Justin Walker) determined to save her grandson from Chicago's violent streets and incarceration with an ingenious plan -- a very personal life and death struggle takes a surprising turn.

Also featured after this inspirational presentation are short theatrical pieces from veteran Atlanta theatre artists and up and coming talent: *Sum of Us*, by Mary Lynn Owen (Actor, Writer); *Incense* by Theresa Davis (originally written and performed for Horizon's The Ghosts of Little Five Points); *Be A Hero* by Eden Mew (*Madeline's Christmas, The Ghosts of Little Five Points*); and powerful recitations of past historical voices performed by Aminah Williams and Derrick Robertson, Jr. (Horizon Apprentice Company 2020).

# PREMIERING ON WORLD AIDS DAY, DEC 1, 2020

Written by southern playwright, Clarinda Ross, directed by award-winning director, Horizon Associate Artist, Heidi McKerley (*The Wolves*, and *ONCE*), *Love M.* was presented in partnership with AIDS Healthcare Foundation for a December 1, 2020 World AIDS Day premiere. The free virtual premiere featudred Lamman Rucker of the television show *Greenleaf* and Terry Burrell of stage and screen and can be seen on Horizon's YouTube, Facebook, and web channels for viewers across the globe. The show also included a virtual after-show community conversation with Black and gay thought leaders to delve further into the issues in the play.

Told through letters, *Love*, *M*. is the story of two mothers at the dawn of AIDS. Atlanta white socialite Deborah writes to her son, Chris, who is pursuing his dream of becoming an actor. Myrtle, a Black southern Baptist, writes to her son, Timothy, an idealistic young lawyer. With humor and humanity, and the AIDS Quilt as backdrop, *Love*, *M*. weaves the abiding threads of the healing power of love, as the characters piece their way towards acceptance.

# Education Programming NEW SOUTH YOUNG PLAYWRIGHTS CONTEST AND FESTIVAL

Now in its 24th year, the New South Young Playwrights Festival focuses on the support and development of the next generation of American dramatists. Each year, Horizon solicits plays from students in high schools in Georgia and colleges nationwide. More than 100 plays are evaluated by a panel of professional theatre artists and educators. The 20-30 winners of the contest are invited to participate in the Festival, a tuition-free, week-long playwriting intensive training program that culminates in a public reading of students' works. This year the New South Young Playwrights Festival took place May 31 –June 5, 2021. This is the second year Horizon presented the New South Young Playwrights Festival virtually, again a resounding success. Here is an example of the (2021) program.

#### PLAYWRIGHTS IN-SCHOOL RESIDENCIES

In addition to **The New South Young Playwrights Festival**, Horizon also conducts FREE **Playwriting in School Residencies**. Horizons residencies offer schools an opportunity to expand their curriculum and increase their students' writing and critical thinking skills in a fun, challenging and participatory format. The program cultivates writing skills, creativity, collaboration, self-awareness, confidence and knowledge of theatre as an art form in participating students. It gives access to the arts and teaches discipline, teamwork, analytical thinking, and problem-solving to young people regardless of their chosen career path or extracurricular activities. Playwriting residency students are also encouraged to submit new plays to **Horizon's New South Young Playwrights Contest and Festival**. Residencies last 1-10 weeks and may take place during school hours or after school. Currently Horizon has provided over 40 semester-long playwriting residencies to middle and high schools. For the past two years, we successfully made the transition to teaching these classes online and were able to serve more schools by reducing the playwriting teacher's travel time.

Our teaching artists have experience with creating safe spaces where students are comfortable working as an ensemble, sharing ideas, participating in group exercises, and giving constructive feedback on peer writing. Our **Playwriting in School** teaching artist is an award-winning playwright. Suehyla El-Attar is an Atlanta-based professional female playwright of color who has successfully taught our residencies since 2014 and whose plays have been produced at Horizon and all over the country.

Horizons Playwriting in School Residencies are in alignment with national and state performance standard curriculum areas: Theatre/Drama and English/Language Arts and adheres to the Georgia Fine Arts Standards for Excellence (GSE) for Grades 9-12 Theatre Arts (Acting I, II, III and Fundamentals of Theatre I and II). The students work on increased composition skills, including developing sentence structure, plot structure, story/ argument arc, and narrative techniques. Our curriculum uses hands-on techniques that lead to each student writing their own short play by the end of the residency. The short plays created are shared publicly as best suits the individual school. This may be a classroom only reading/performance or a public performance at the school or Horizon. When schools choose a staged reading of the students' works at Horizon, we invite family, friends, classmates, and school administration to celebrate with us at the theatre.

#### **Education Partnership with The New School - Teaching Artist Residency**

THE NEW SCHOOL - Horizon Theatre and The New School (TNS) have partnered to allow Horizon to provide theatre department services for The New School, a non-profit alternative high school focused on artists and entrepreneurs. Horizon provides ongoing instruction, production, and performance opportunities throughout the school year. Instruction and experience in all phases of theatre creates this comprehensive program, including areas such as acting, writing, directing, design, and producing. The program also allows for students to utilize the Horizon mainstage for workshops, classes and performances, including their self-produced 24 Hour Play Festival. This partnership allows Horizon to provide ongoing theatre instruction, production, performance opportunities, mentoring from Horizon artists, and collaboration with seniors from Atlanta Senior Centers.

A WEEKEND SHOWCASE OF ONE-ACT PLAYS



Horizon's Apprentice Company is a 10-month training program for post-college graduates who are starting their careers in playwriting, acting or stage management. The program introduces them to the business side of theatre, cultivates their skills, exposes them the to the Metro Atlanta market, and fosters mentorships. The program is helmed by Horizon Associate Producer and Atlanta veteran actress, teacher and director Marguerite Hannah. Many of our Apprentice Company members go on to work in Atlanta, all over Georgia and across the country in theatre, television and film. In 2020, Horizon apprentices successfully completed their end of the year programming (classes, seminars, and performances) virtually. We featured a weekend showcase of their one-act plays this October as part of our *Horizon at Home* offering. The program has gone on hiatus during 2021 and is being revised for relaunch in 2022.


Horizon's area premiere of *Sweet Water Taste* was a huge hit with Atlanta audiences. It was produced as part of Horizon's New South Play Festival program. Now in its 23rd year, the New South Play Festival is Horizon's year-round program that develops and produces new plays from, for and about the contemporary South, with a focus on plays by women, writers of color and writers from the region. Horizon has garnered national acclaim as a center for development of new plays and writers from our region. The Festival has been hailed by *Creative Loafing* as "the place that finds and defines Southern plays.

All hell and a little bit of heaven break loose in this funny, irreverent, and topical play. When Elijah Beckford, a prominent southern black undertaker, approaches his wealthy white cousins, Charlie and Elizabeth Beckford, and demands to be buried in "the family cemetery," chaos ensues. The show featured a cast of some of Atlanta's finest actors, including Atlanta favorites: Lala Cochran, Enoch King and Chris Kayser as well as LaParee Young and Jen Harper, both stars of the hit television show *Greenleaf*. Horizon continued to positivily impact audiences with after-show *Community Conversations*, where audiences members had the opportunity to hold candid dialogues about finding common ground in race relations in America today.







We were delighted to open our 2019, 35<sup>th</sup> Anniversary season with the Southeastern premiere of this innovative new play. Horizon took "Girl Power" to the next level as the cast, made up some of the most talented and diverse young actresses in Atlanta, took the stage and Horizon's audiences by storm. Pipeline was nominated for five 2018 Lucille Lortel Awards, including 'Outstanding Play,' and playwright, Dominique Morisseau is a 2018 MacArthur Genius Grant Recipient. This powerful and timely play tells the story of Nya Joseph, a dedicated, inner-city public high school teacher who is committed to her students' achievement, while she sends her only son, Omari, to a private boarding school. When Omari is involved in a controversial incident which threatens him with expulsion from his school, Nya is forced to reconcile Omari's rage, her own parental decisions, and the public and private school systems, as she rallies to save her son. Horizon partnered with The Atlanta Board of Education to bring educators to the play, which drew racially and age diverse audiences, including parenting and school groups, all of which saw the show at discounted rates. Directed by the award-winning husband and wife team, Tinashe Kajese Bolden & Keith Arthur Bolden, audiences and critics were stunned by the quiet and intense beauty of this show, which saw many teary-eyed standing ovations. After leaving the show, one audience member left a tear-filled voice message saying, "I am so emotional that I needed to call you and tell you that Pipeline was a truly excellent play. The acting was superb...everything was excellent...Thank you, thank you so very much for the work you do."

Making its Southeastern Premiere and directed by Horizon Apprentice Company Co-Director, Lauren Morris, *The Cake* was a favorite of both critics and audiences alike. When Della, a North Carolina baker and devout Christian, is asked to bake a wedding cake for her best friend's daughter, she is overjoyed. But that joy is short-lived when she learns that the intended is another bride. Struggling to reconcile her deeply-held belief in "traditional marriage" and the love she has for the woman she helped raise, Della finds herself in strange new territory. Inspired by a story ripped from the headlines, this marvelously funny play by Bekah Brunstetter (producer and writer for TV's *This is Us*) is proof that love is the key ingredient in creating common ground. Horizon partnered with AIDS Healthcare Foundation, Macy's, local United Methodist Churches, Synagogues, and many LGBTQIA organizations to sponsor *Community Conversations* to further discuss important issues in the play. The show reached deep into the LGBTQIA community as well as attracting a racially and age diverse audience of returning and new patrons. Per the playwrights suggestion, and adding to the excitement of the production, Horizon partnered with several community bakeries, who provided bite-sized pieces of cake to each audience member as they exited the theatre after each show.
